Tuition Policy

Dance Spectrum tuition is based on a full season, running from September 15, 2025, to June 13, 2026 (Recital). Tuition is a course fee, and all prices account for holidays. We do not prorate for late registrations.

Cash/Check pricing reflects a savings of 4% when you pay with cash, check, or electronically via a checking or savings account.

TUITION: All accounts must have a form of payment on file (CC, EFT checking or savings). Payments can be made anytime before the 1st of the month. Any unpaid accounts will be automatically charged to the payment method on file on the 1st of the month. Payment arrangements are available upon request - please contact the office.

LATE FEES: A \$10 Late Fee will be applied to your account for each charge category (tuition, costumes, private lessons, competition fees etc) paid after its due date.

OTHER POLICIES

- Family discounts include: 5% off for the 2nd child, 10% off for the 3rd child (some restrictions may apply). All students must reside at the same address to qualify for the sibling discount.
- Please Note: the total amount displayed in your portal reflects cash/check pricing for the 2025-2026 season.
- You SAVE 4% by paying with ACH (online) OR cash/check (at the office)
- There are no make-ups or refunds for missed classes.
- A \$30 service fee is charged on all returned checks.
- A \$20 service fee is charged for an ACH return.
- After 2 checks are returned for insufficient funds, your account must be paid with cash or credit only.
- Students with accounts more than two months past due will not be allowed to attend class until the balance, including late fees, is paid in full.

Costume Fees

All costume fees are due **November 1, 2025**.

Payments can be made anytime before the due date. Any unpaid accounts will automatically be processed on to your primary method of payment in file on November 1st.

- Please remove all street shoes and boots at designated locations.
- Dancers should always have a water bottle with them in class. Please label your dancer's water bottle.
- Only water is allowed in the studios, No food, drinks, or gum is allowed in class.
- Student must act respectfully and appropriately while on any possible scheduled breaks.
- Cell phones may not be brought into class. Please turn cellphones and watches to silent mode to not interrupt class.
- Smoking and vaping are prohibited on the Dance Spectrum property.

OUR CLASSES

Offered for Boys & Girls

PreSchool 3 is a program designed for 3 year olds that teaches more than just dance!! This class incorporates engaging music, interactive props and presents a classroom structure (following directions, taking turns, spatial awareness as well as developing friendships) all while introducing beginning ballet curriculum, rhythm, balance and gross motor skills.

PreSchool 4 is a continuation of the PS3 program or for brand new 4 year olds. This class maintains and builds on ballet basics and strengthens gross motor development. The tap portion of class will help further develop rhythm, balance and coordination.

PeeWee Acro is for 3-4 year old Boys & Girls. Acro is based on safe and effective progressions in five areas; flexibility, strengthening, balancing, limbering and tumbling, similar to floor gymnastics.

Acro (ages 5 & up) is based on safe and effective progressions in five areas; flexibility, strengthening, balancing, limbering and tumbling, similar to floor gymnastics.

Level 2: Dancers must be able to execute skills such as both side cartwheels, backbends down & up, front limbers and backbend kickovers.

Ballet (ages 5 & up) is a Classical dance form demanding strength, grace and precision. Ballet is used as the foundation in all dance forms.

Hip Hop (ages 5 & up) is best described as high energy and original. Strengthening and conditioning will help build a solid foundation for Breaking, Locking, Housing and more.

Level 2: Dancers 9 years old & older with 3 or more years of experience in each style. Years of experience starts after dancers complete the Mini Program and are a part of our Recreational Program.

Level 3: is an invitation only Recreational program for any dancer who is 14 years old & older with multiple years of experience in each style.

Jazz (ages 5 & up) dance combines the technique of Ballet and Modern dance with the current forms of popular dance. Jazz has its own vocabulary ranging from isolations to the movement of the entire body. The Jazz curriculum includes stretching, jumps, rhythm and various styles of movement.

Level 2: Dancers 9 years old & older with 3 or more years of experience in each style. Years of experience starts after dancers complete the Mini Program and are a part of our Recreational Program.

Lyrical (ages 7 & up) is a fusion of Jazz and Ballet styles with a concentration of Ballet technique. Lyrical focuses on fluid movements and expressive emotion. We highly recommend all Lyrical students take a weekly Ballet class.

Level 2: Dancers 9 years old & older with 3 or more years of experience in each style. Years of experience starts after dancers complete the Mini Program and are a part of our Recreational Program.

Level 3: is an invitation only Recreational program for any dancer who is 14 years old & older with multiple years of experience in each style.

Musical Theater (ages 5 & up) is a combination of dancing and acting, similar to what would be seen in musicals and Broadway shows. Dancers learn to incorporate personalities & story lines into their story.

Tap (ages 5 & up) is a percussive style of dance. Its name comes from the tapping sound made when metal plates on the dancer's shoes touch the floor. Students will learn to understand rhythm and timing while working on footwork and agility.

Level 2: Dancers 9 years old & older with 3 or more years of experience in each style. Years of experience starts after dancers complete the Mini Program and are a part of our Recreational Program.

Boys Crew is our boys only program. We have 2 levels, ages 3-6 & ages 7 & up. In our Boys Crew, ages 3-6, dancers will work on Hip Hop and Acrobatic skills. In our Boys Crew, 7 & up, dancers will work on their Hip Hop skills.



OUR SAFETY POLICIES

The safety and well-being of your child is our highest priority. At Dance Spectrum, we are dedicated to creating a secure, healthy, and supportive environment where every dancer can thrive.

Safety at a Glance:

Certified Staff – All faculty and staff are trained in CPR, First Aid, and AED use. An AED machine is conveniently located near the front desk.

Age-Appropriate Instruction – We take pride in providing age-appropriate choreography, music, and costuming to ensure a positive and respectful learning experience.

State-of-the-Art Facilities – Each studio is equipped with sprung floors for injury prevention, top-tier sound and tech equipment, and ceiling fans with HVAC systems featuring MERV 10 filters for air quality.

Fire & Emergency Preparedness

- Fire extinguishers are stationed at the front and back of the building.
- Smoke detectors and emergency lighting are installed throughout the facility.
- There are four exits in the front of the building and two in the back for easy evacuation.

Security Measures

- The front desk is equipped with a panic button, activating a warning light in each studio to signal a lockdown if necessary.
- Every studio has two entry/exit points with deadbolt-secured doors.
- An intercom system connects all rooms, and each studio has an emergency bag with first aid supplies.
- Regular safety drills are conducted, including fire, lockdown, lockout, and active shooter procedures.

Why Is the Dance Spectrum Waiting Room Closed During Classes?

At Dance Spectrum, the safety and well-being of every dancer is our highest priority. To maintain a secure, healthy, and supportive environment, we have implemented policies that allow us to focus on the protection and development of our students.

We have taken extensive steps to ensure that our facility is equipped to handle emergency situations:

- **Secure Exits:** Our building has four exits in the front and two in the back to allow for quick and efficient evacuation if necessary.
- **Panic Button System:** The front desk is equipped with a panic button that activates warning lights in each studio to signal a lockdown if needed.
- **Controlled Studio Access:** Each studio has two entry/exit points, both secured with deadbolt locks to prevent unauthorized access.
- **Intercom Communication:** An intercom system connects all studios, allowing for instant communication in case of an emergency.
- **Emergency Preparedness Kits:** Every studio is stocked with an emergency bag containing first aid supplies.
- **Routine Safety Drills:** We conduct regular fire, lockdown, lockout, and active shooter drills to ensure staff and students are prepared.

Why Close the Waiting Room?

To uphold these safety measures and create the most secure environment possible, limiting public access to the building during class time is essential. By keeping the waiting room closed:

- We reduce unnecessary foot traffic, ensuring that only authorized individuals are present.
- We maintain a focused and distraction-free atmosphere for our dancers.
- We enhance emergency response efficiency, allowing staff to account for everyone inside the building quickly.

If your child obtains an injury which restricts their participation in class, parent should notify the office.




